#### FRAMING THE WEEK

Democratic leaders are beginning to float proposals for a fifth **COVID-19 relief package** that could rival the \$2 trillion CARES Act (Pub. L. 116-136). However, Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) indicated another package would likely not be considered until members return to Washington next week at the earliest. Leader McConnell has also expressed serious concerns over the national debt and suggested states declare bankruptcy (currently not allowed under current law) instead of receiving federal aid, setting up a political battle that could further delay legislative action.

Meanwhile, President Trump has already <u>tweeted</u> his wish list for the next legislative package – including "fiscal relief to **state/local governments** for lost revenues from COVID-19," "**infrastructure investments** for bridges, tunnels, broadband" and "**payroll tax cuts**."

When asked last Friday how much funding is needed in the next bill for state and local governments, House Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) called for a level comparable to the amount given to small businesses, which would be close to \$700 billion. A bipartisan bill <u>unveiled</u> by Sens. Bob Menendez (D-NJ) and Bill Cassidy (R-LA), which would create a \$500 billion fund to provide relief to states and localities, may be a viable option, especially since its aligns with a recent request made by the <u>National Governors Association</u>. The legislation would also expand eligibility to include counties and towns with populations of 50,000 or greater and allow funds to be used for lost revenues. The \$150 billion Coronavirus Relief Fund, made available in the CARES Act, is limited to jurisdictions with at least 500,000 people and may only be used to cover new costs of responding to the pandemic.

Senate Minority Leader Chuck Schumer (D-NY) also said Democrats would continue to push for other priorities, including federal assistance for people having trouble paying **rent**; **hazard pay** for essential workers, and a 15 percent increase in **Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits**.

Today, health care providers can begin registering for the Health Resources and Service Administration (HRSA)'s program in order to seek reimbursement for COVID-19 related testing and treatment for uninsured patients furnished on or after February 4, 2020. Providers will be reimbursed at Medicare rates, subject to available funding. Regarding next steps, providers can begin submitting claims electronically on May 6 and expect to receive reimbursements in mid-May.

In addition, \$10 billion allocated for **rural health clinics and hospitals** and \$400 million to **Indian Health Service facilities** may be distributed as soon as this week. Funding will be allocated based on operating expenses. HHS <u>noted</u> that certain providers, including **skilled nursing facilities**, **dentists**, **and providers that solely take Medicaid**, will receive further, separate funding. The administration did not provide further insight into how much these providers should expect or what factors will be considered when determining the additional amounts.

## Thurs. (4/23)

• The House passed the Senate-approved Paycheck Protection Program and Health Care Enhancement Act (H.R. 266) – a \$484 billion relief package to provide additional coronavirus relief to small business, health care providers, and hospitals, as well as provide funding to expand COVID-19 testing capacity. - **HHS** <u>announced</u> it is extending the deadline for hospitals to submit data that will inform how \$10 billion is distributed to areas highly impacted by COVID-19. The new deadline is Saturday, April 25 by 3PM ET. Details.
- CDC issued a supplemental funding opportunity titled, "Tribal Public Health Capacity-Building and Quality Improvement Umbrella Cooperative Agreement" (CDC-RFA-OT18-18030301SUPP20). Details.

## Thurs. (4/23)

- **SBA and the Treasury** released <u>Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)</u> regarding Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loans. <u>Details</u>.
- **CMS** recently announced two sets of guidance documents affecting individual and group market health plan issuers, Medicare Advantage (MA) sponsors, and Medicare Part D sponsors. <u>Details</u>.
- **CMS** announced new <u>guidance</u> that will allow independent freestanding emergency departments (IFEDs) to provide care to Medicare and Medicaid beneficiaries during the COVID-19 public health emergency. <u>Details</u>.

## Wed. (4/22)

- **HHS** <u>announced</u> its plan for allocating and disseminating the remaining \$70B of the \$100B appropriated to the Provider Relief Fund under the CARES Act. <u>Details</u>.
- The Medicare Trustees released their annual report outlining the future solvency of the Medicare program. Of note, the following projections do not account for the potential effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, as the Trustees believe it would not be possible to adjust their estimates accurately at this time. Details.
- **CMS** issued a memorandum to all eligible qualified health plan (QHP) issuers announcing reporting flexibilities for the Quality Rating System (QRS), the QHP Enrollee Experience Survey, and Quality Improvement Strategy Programs (QIS). Details.
- **HHS Office of the Secretary** sent a letter to administrators requesting that all <u>hospitals</u> report certain data elements by April 23, 2020. <u>Details</u>.

## Tue. (4/21)

- CMS and ONC officially published the final rules on interoperability, information blocking, and the ONC Health IT Certification Program in the Federal Register. Both rules are effective on June 30, 2020. Details.
- **FDA** <u>issued</u> draft guidance on technical considerations for demonstrating reliability of emergency-use injectors. This guidance is intended to provide considerations for emergency-use injectors marketed with emergency-use products under a biologics license application (BLA), new drug application (NDA), or abbreviated new drug application (ANDA). <u>Details</u>.
- **NIH** announced the first <u>treatment guidelines for COVID-19 patients</u>, intended for healthcare providers. Details.
- **FDA** issued final guidance on nonbinding feedback after certain FDA inspections of device establishments that identifies a standardized method for communicating and submitting requests for nonbinding feedback and describes how the agency responds to the requests. <u>Details</u>.
- HHS announced \$955 million in grants from ACL to help communities meet the needs of older adults and people with disabilities as they work to minimize the spread of COVID-19. The grants, authorized through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act, increase funding for ACL's programs by 40 percent. <a href="Details">Details</a>.

## Mon. (4/20)

• CMS <u>issued</u> recommendations to re-open healthcare systems in communities that have low incidence of COVID-19 and are in Phase 1 of the Guidelines for Opening Up America Again. This guidance updates previous recommendations on limiting non-essential surgeries and medical procedures during the COVID-19 pandemic. <u>Details</u>.

## Fri. (4/17)

- CMS released an <u>article</u> providing guidance on implementing several provisions of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act related to Inpatient Prospective Payment System (IPPS) hospitals, Long-Term Care Hospitals (LTCHs), and Inpatient Rehabilitation Facilities (IRFs). Details.
- USDA's Rural Development Service announced the opening of a second application window for funding under the Distance Learning and Telemedicine (DLT) grant program with new funding from the CARES Act. Applications from rural applicants are due July 13. Details.
- USDA's Food and Nutrition Service published a <u>notice</u> reopening the public comment period on a <u>request for information</u> issued in January on the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC Program) National Universal Product Code (NUPC) Database. Details.
- CMS published <u>notice</u> to extend the comment period on a <u>notice of proposed</u> <u>rulemaking</u> (NPRM) that would revise requirements for Preadmission Screening and Resident Review (PASRR) by Medicaid-certified nursing facilities (NFs). <u>Details</u>.

#### **COMMENT & APPLICATION DEADLINES**

- **Apr. 30:** HRSA <u>issued</u> final eligibility guidelines for the Reimbursement of Travel and Subsistence Expenses Towards Living Organ Donation Program. Comments due April 30. Details.
- May 5: FDA <u>issued</u> draft guidance on the inclusion of older adults in cancer clinical trials. The agency notes that older adults are those ages 65 and older, and the guidance emphasizes the particular importance of including adults over the age of 75 in clinical cancer trials. <u>Details</u>.
- May 7: HRSA invites nominations for qualified tribal officials for appointment as voluntary delegate members on the HRSA Tribal Advisory Council (TAC). Details.
- **May 13:** GAO is accepting nominations for participation on the Board of Governors of the Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute (PCORI). <u>Details</u>.
- May 15: SBA is accepting comments on an <u>interim final rule</u> providing additional guidance regarding the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) established by the CARES Act. PPP loans are available to apply for until June 30, or until the funds run out. <u>Details</u>.
- May 18: USDA is accepting comments on a <u>proposed rule</u> titled "Employment and Training Opportunities in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)." <u>Details</u>.
- May 18: NIH <u>issued</u> an RFI to assist in the development of the National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney Diseases (NIDDK) Strategic Plan. The NIDDK's goal is to develop a broad vision for accelerating research into the causes, prevention, and treatment of diseases and conditions within the Institute's mission. Details.
- May 20: SBA issued an <u>interim final rule</u> to supplement the first interim final rule on the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP), with additional guidance regarding eligibility for individuals with self-employment income and certain businesses. <u>Details</u>.
- May 20: CMS extended the comment period on a <u>notice of proposed rulemaking</u> (NPRM) that would revise and modernize requirements for Preadmission Screening and Resident Review (PASRR) in Medicaid-certified nursing facilities (NFs). Details.

- May 31: CMS released a request for information (RFI) seeking input on ways to improve access, quality, and outcomes for rural maternal and infant health. Details.
- May 31: FDA is accepting comments on two proposed amendments regarding the classification of certain hepatitis C virus (HCV) tests. <u>Details</u>.
- **June 1:** CMS is accepting comments on an interim final rule implementing a sweeping array of new provider flexibilities for supporting the health care system's response to the COVID-19 pandemic (press release). The changes leverage many of the avenues available to the agency in affecting policy, importantly including blanket 1135 waiver authority and the agency's interim final rulemaking ability. Details.
- **June 1:** CDC and NIOSH issued a <u>request for information</u> soliciting public comments to inform the scope of the World Trade Center (WTC) Health Program's research funding cycle for fiscal year (FY) 2021. <u>Details</u>.
- **June 9:** CMS is accepting comments on proposed rules for fiscal year (FY) 2021 Medicare payment across three different payment streams: Skilled nursing facilities (SNF); the Hospice wage index and payment rate update; and Inpatient psychiatric facilities (IPF). <u>Details</u>.
- **June 15:** CMS requests comment on the fiscal year (FY) 2021 inpatient rehabilitation facility (IRF) prospective payment system (PPS) proposed rule (<u>fact sheet</u>). <u>Details</u>.
- **June 16:** CDC issued a <u>request for comment</u> soliciting input on and experiences with pain and pain management to inform the agency's assessment of the need for updating or expanding the 2016 CDC Guideline for Prescribing Opioids for Chronic Pain. <u>Details</u>.
