FRAMING THE WEEK

This week, congressional committees will convene hearings on top priorities, including the President's fiscal year (FY) 2023 budget request, health of older adults, and mental health. Today, Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer (D-NY) is expected to tee up a Wednesday vote on the Women's Health Protection Act (WHPA) of 2022 (S. 4132), which would prohibit government restrictions on the provision of, and access to, abortion services.

The Senate version of WHPA includes some changes to address concerns from moderate lawmakers (e.g., removed language saying abortion restrictions perpetuate "white supremacy" and are "a tool of gender oppression"). However, the Senate is not expected to clear the 60-vote filibuster threshold. Still, the largely symbolic vote is intended to get lawmakers on the record regarding reproductive rights ahead of the anticipated Supreme Court decision overturning *Roe v. Wade*. In February 2022, Senate Majority Leader Schumer attempted to pass the House version of WHPA (H.R. 3755) but failed in a 46-48 vote to overcome the filibuster. The House passed the bill along party lines (218-211) back in September 2021.

House Appropriations Committee hearings will continue with <u>directors from the National Institute of Health</u> testifying on the fiscal year 2023 budget proposal. The Committee will also hold hearings on funding for the Department of Housing and Urban Development and National Science Foundation, among other federal agencies. On Thursday, a panel of advocates and experts will appear before the Committee to <u>discuss</u> how to maximize the independence, well-being, and health of older adults.

The House Energy and Commerce (E&C) Subcommittee on Health is expected to mark up this week the Restoring Hope for Mental Health and Well-Being Act of 2022 – a bipartisan bill introduced by E&C Chairman Frank Pallone, Jr. (D-NJ) and Ranking Member Cathy McMorris Rodgers (R-WA) (WHG summary). The legislation mostly reauthorizes key programs at the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) and the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA). Highlights include:

- Establishes a Behavioral Health Crisis Coordinating Office within SAMHSA;
- Establishes a maternal mental health hotline;
- Eliminates the option for nonfederal governmental health plans to elect out of mental health parity compliance;
- Reauthorizes important programs that focus on substance use disorder prevention treatment, and recovery support;
- Addresses youth mental health by reauthorizing the Comprehensive Community Mental Health Services for Children with Serious Emotional Disturbances, Youth and family TREE programs, and the Pediatric Mental Health Care Access grant program.

On Thursday, the Senate Judiciary Committee will mark up the Justice and Mental Health Collaboration Reauthorization Act of 2022 (S. 3846) – a bipartisan bill that would reauthorize the <u>Justice and Mental Health Collaboration Program</u>, which integrates mental health care and law enforcement. The lead

sponsors are Sens. John Cornyn (R-TX), Amy Klobuchar (D-MN), Sheldon Whitehouse (D-RI), Thom Tillis (R-NC), Dick Durbin (D-IL), and Chuck Grassley (R-IA).
