FRAMING THE WEEK

With less than two weeks until the next recess, Congress continues to tackle a slate of priorities, including mental health, ARPA-H, LGBTQI+ data inclusion, and FY 2023 government funding. COVID-19 vaccines for children under five are now <u>authorized</u> and <u>recommended</u> by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The Biden Administration has begun distributing pediatric vaccinations, which will be available at pediatric practices, pharmacies, Federally Qualified Health Centers, local health departments, clinics, and other locations this week, announced CDC. The Calendar Year (CY) 2023 Medicare payment updates move closer to release.

Mental Health

The House is further along in the process on mental health legislation than the Senate. Later this week, the House is scheduled to vote on a pair of mental health bills. Later today, the House Rules Committee will meet to consider amendments to the legislation.

- Restoring Hope for Mental Health and Well-being Act of 2022 (H.R. 7666), introduced by House Energy and Commerce (E&C) Committee Chair Frank Pallone, Jr. (D-NJ) and Ranking Member Cathy McMorris Rogers, would reauthorize over 30 programs related to mental health and substance use disorder within the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) and the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) (WHG summary). E&C unanimously approved the bill earlier this month. The manager's amendment includes provisions to increase transparency of pharmacy benefit managers (PBMs) in insurance plans by requiring them to submit reports on usage of rebates, copayment assistance, covered drugs, and other data.
- Enhancing Mental Health and Suicide Prevention Through Campus Planning Act (H.R. 5407), introduced by Reps. Susan Wild (D-PA) and Fred Keller (R-PA), would require the Department of Education to encourage institutions of higher education to develop and implement comprehensive campus mental health and suicide prevention plans. The House Education and Labor Committee unanimously approved the bill last month.

Meanwhile, the bipartisan group led by Sen. Chris Murphy (D-CT) is transforming the <u>bipartisan framework</u> into legislative text. The package includes provisions to expands the <u>Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic model</u>; increase investments in mental health and suicide prevention programs, including school-based mental health and supportive services; and provide funding to increase access to mental and behavioral health services for youth and families in crisis via telehealth.

The Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions is expected to soon mark up the Mental Health Reform Reauthorization Act of 2022 (S. 4170), which has several similar provisions to H.R. 7666 (WHG summary). So far, the Senate Finance Committee has released discussion drafts on telemental

health (WHG summary) and youth mental health (WHG summary). Discussion drafts from the three remaining workgroups – workforce, parity, and care integration – are expected in the coming weeks.

Other House Votes: ARPA-H, LGBTQI+ Data

The House is also scheduled to vote on the following bills:

- Advanced Research Projects Agency-Health Act (H.R. 5585), introduced by House E&C Health
 Subcommittee Chair Anna Eshoo (D-CA), would require the Department of Health and Human
 Services (HHS) to move ARPA-H to an independent division within HHS no later than 180 days
 after enactment. E&C approved the bill by a vote of 53-3. The Biden Administration established
 ARPA-H "as an independent entity within the National Institute of Health."
- LGBTQI+ Data Inclusion Act (H.R. 4176), introduced by Rep. Raúl Grijalva (D-AZ), would require
 federal surveys to collect voluntary information on sexual orientation, gender identity, and variations
 in sex characteristics. The House Oversight and Reform Committee approved the bill by a 23-16
 vote earlier this month. Last Wednesday, President Biden signed an executive order that
 establishes a new federal coordinating committee to strengthen the federal collection of sexual
 orientation and gender identity (SOGI) data (WHG summary).

Appropriations

With the goal of floor votes before the August recess, the House Appropriations Committee will continue to mark up FY 2023 appropriations bills this week.

- Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and Related Agencies bill full committee markup is on June 23;
- Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and Related Agencies bill subcommittee markup is on June 23, and full committee markup is on June 30; and
- Transportation, and Housing and Urban Development, and Related Agencies bill subcommittee markup is on June 23, and full committee markup is on June 30.

Top appropriators continue to negotiate topline numbers for FY 2023 government funding. A continuing resolution, level-funding the government possibly through the end of the calendar year, remains a possibility. The stopgap measure could provide a must-pass vehicle for bipartisan legislative priorities.

Regulatory Update

Last week, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) issued its proposed payment update for the Medicare Home Health Prospective Payment System (HH PPS). Notably, the proposal included a negative 7.69 percent payment adjustment for the 30-day payment rate to home health agencies in 2023. Our full summary of the proposed rule is available here.

The release of this rule marks the first Medicare payment proposal for the calendar year (CY) 2023 update cycle. An additional proposed update for Medicare's end stage renal disease (ESRD) PPS <u>cleared review</u> by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) late last week and is expected for release imminently. The remaining CY 2023 payment proposals – the Hospital Outpatient PPS; Physician Fee Schedule – currently remain under review by OMB.
