FRAMING THE WEEK

This week, we continue to track key developments regarding the slimmed down budget reconciliation package, expected to only include drug pricing provisions (<u>WHG summary</u>) and a two-year extension to ACA premium subsidy enhancements. The Senate Parliamentarian is expected to review the legislative text later this week to ensure it complies with the Byrd Rule, which prohibits the inclusion of "extraneous matters," such as provisions that make "incidental" changes to spending or revenue. Given the procedures required for reconciliation, a Senate vote is anticipated the first week of August before recess.

Meanwhile, the House will vote on a six-bill appropriations minibus, which we view as a starting point for negotiations on FY 2023 government funding later this year. Due in part to time constraints and political factors, we anticipate Congress will pass a continuing resolution for FY 2023, level funding the government until at least after the midterm elections and possibly through early December. The Senate Appropriations Committee aims to release their FY 2023 bills by the end of July. Additionally, House Democratic leaders continue to keep the fight for abortion rights and gun safety top of mind.

Reproductive Health

Tomorrow, the House Energy and Commerce Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations will hold a <u>hearing</u> on the impacts of U.S. Supreme Court reversing *Roe v. Wade*. The panel includes perspectives from both sides of the debate, including abortion advocates, such as the American Medical Association, as well as the CEO-Elect of the American Association of Prolife Obstetricians and Gynecologists (<u>hearing memorandum</u>).

The House will also vote on (and is expected to pass) the **Right to Contraception Act (H.R. 8373)**. Similar to the two bills (H.R. 8296 and H.R. 8297) on abortion access passed last week, this bill is unlikely to be considered in the Senate due to the 60-vote filibuster threshold. In the meantime, the Biden Administration is trying to bolster access to reproductive health services through the President's Executive Order (WHG summary). The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Secretary recently issued guidance explaining the enforcement of the Emergency Medical Treatment and Active Labor Act (EMTALA) with respect Supreme Court decision overturning the recent Roe v. Wade.

Gun Safety

On Wednesday, the House Judiciary Committee will hold the first <u>markup</u> on assault weapons ban legislation in two decades. The **Assault Weapons Ban of 2021 (<u>H.R. 1808</u>)**, introduced by Rep. David Cicilline (D-RI) and sponsored by 212 Democrats, would make it unlawful for a person to import, sell, manufacture, or transfer of certain semi-automatic weapons. The Committee will also consider the **Equal Access to Justice for Victims of Gun Violence Act (<u>H.R. 2814</u>), introduced by Rep. Adam Schiff (D-CA) and supported by 62 Democrats, which would allow victims of gun violence to pursue civil cases in state and federal courts against gun makers, distributors, sellers or trade associations. While both bills are expected to pass the House, they are highly unlikely to be taken up in the Senate, due in part to the recent enactment of the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act (BSCA) (P.L. 117-159)** (WHG summary).

Regulatory Update

With last week's release of the calendar year (CY) 2023 hospital outpatient prospective payment system (HOPPS) proposed rule (WHG summary), the Administration has concluded its major proposed rulemaking for the 2023 Medicare payment update cycle. We now await finalization of these proposals later this summer and fall.

In the meantime, the Administration recently announced its broader suite of intended rulemaking in its 2022 spring update to the Unified Agenda. This resource outlines the proposed and final rulemaking the Administration plans to advance as well as the timeframe in which it plans to promulgate each new regulatory action. The updated Unified Agenda features rulemaking across the Administration's various health care priorities, including equity, mental health, data interoperability, tobacco, Medicaid access, and more.
