FRAMING THE WEEK

This week, the Medicare Payment Advisory Commission (MedPAC) kicks of the 2022-2023 meeting cycle with sessions on Medicare Advantage (MA) benefit standardization, wage index, Part B drugs, and other topics. In addition to serving as a public forum for commissioners to formulate recommendations to Congress in their March and June 2023 reports, MedPAC meetings also signal to the Administration which policy issues to prioritize and, if possible, address through rulemaking or guidance.

Commissioners will begin with a discussion on the context for the Medicare program, which will shape the context chapter of the March 2023 report to Congress and serve as background for all discussions this cycle. Each year, the context chapter highlights key national trends in health care spending for the Medicare program in particular and the country as a whole (<u>WHG summary</u> of March 2022 report). Medicare Trustees <u>estimate</u> that the Hospital Insurance Trust Fund (which pays for Medicare Part A services) will be depleted by 2028 (previously estimated to be 2026) (WHG summary).

Commissioners also examine the factors that contribute to Medicare spending growth, such as evolving demographics and growth in the volume and intensity of services provided. They are also expected to discuss the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the Medicare program. The COVID-19 public health emergency is currently set to expire on October 13, 2022, but we anticipate that the Biden Administration will extend the PHE another 90 days to January 11, 2023.

Details on other sessions:

- Standardizing benefits in Medicare Advantage plans Commissioners are concerned that
 increased plan offerings and wide variation in benefit packages may make it difficult for
 beneficiaries to choose a plan that meets their needs. They will examine how MA plans set cost
 sharing for Part A and Part B services as well as how other players standardize benefit packages.
 Commissioners will provide guidance on future work.
- Medicare Advantage encounter data MedPAC continues to monitor the accuracy and completeness of encounter data. In the June 2019 report to Congress, MedPAC recommended Congress direct the Health and Human Services Secretary to establish thresholds for completeness and accuracy; evaluate MA organization's submitted data and provide robust feedback; and concurrently apply a payment withhold and provide refunds to MA organizations that meet thresholds. As of June 2022, CMS has not fully validated encounter data needed to accurately adjust payments to Medicare Advantage organizations, as the Government Accountability Office (GAO) recommended back in 2014.
- Reforming Medicare's wage index system Despite additional adjustments to Medicare's wage
 index system by Congress and CMS, MedPAC remains concerned about current wage index
 policies, including the system's inaccuracy, the circularity of hospital-reported data, the large

volume of permitted exceptions, and administrative complexity. In 2007, MedPAC recommended (1) Congress authorize the HHS Secretary to establish new wage index systems; and (2) HHS Secretary establish a hospital compensation index that:

- Uses wage data from all employers and industry-specific occupational weights,
- o Is adjusted for geographic differences in the ratio of benefits to wages,
- o Is adjusted at the county level and smooths large differences between counties, and
- Is implemented so that large changes in wage index values are phased in over a transition period.
- Addressing high prices of drugs covered under Medicare Part B MedPAC will continue to refine policy approaches for Medicare to address high prices of drugs covered under Medicare Part B. In the June 2022 report to Congress (WHG summary), MedPAC offered three approaches:
 - Addressing uncertain clinical benefit and high launch prices of first-in-class drugs: MedPAC says one approach is to collect clinical evidence about the new drug through coverage with evidence development (CED) and also to set a cap on the drug's payment based on its net clinical benefit compared with the standard of care. The Commission adds they specifically are considering this approach for use of selected accelerated approval drugs since they are approved with uncertain clinical benefit.
 - o **Promoting price competition among drugs with therapeutic alternatives**: The Commission considers the use of reference pricing or consolidated billing codes to increase manufacturer competition among drugs with similar health effects.
 - Improving provider incentives under the ASP payment system: MedPAC explores options for modifying Medicare's current six percent add-on payment to improve financial incentives, including: (1) Placing a fixed dollar limit on the add-on payment; (2) Converting a portion of the percentage add-on to a fixed fee; or (3) a combination of the above two approaches.
